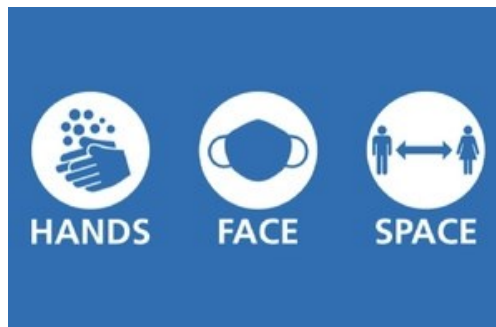
4. As previously, you will receive a copy of your child's timetable with the correct lesson omissions, by separate email – please print and place in a prominent position about the house.

Uniform Expectations

For after Half Term

After half term we are looking forward to welcoming back students into full school uniform. Below is full clarification of our expectations, and procedure for incorrect uniform. Any problems should be communicated to the Head of Year prior to the start of the school day. Thank you for your cooperation.

Uniform Essentials	School Procedure...
School shoes, no trainers.	Students will be given plimsolls to wear if they arrive to school in trainers.
School trousers and black socks or skirt and tights. School shirt and tie, worn long. Skirts always unrolled.	Students will not be allowed to attend lessons or break times if they wear non-school uniform trousers or skirts. This includes the old style school skirt.
School V-Neck Jumper or layers under shirts if required, no hoodies (GAbbot hoodie only on PE days).	Hoodies will be confiscated for 72 hours if they are worn in school. Please do not bring non-school uniform items to school, coats will be allowed in lessons if needed.
School Blazer for every lesson.	Students will be loaned a spare blazer to wear for the day if they do not have one.
Coat (blue or black ideally).	Again, hoodies will be confiscated for 72 hours if worn instead of a coat.
Jewellery and discrete makeup kept to a minimum. One stud in each ear permitted, nose studs and fake nails not allowed.	Excessive make up will be required to be removed at the Head of Year's office. Excessive jewellery will be confiscated.
Mobile phones are not to be seen or used on school site.	Phones will be confiscated until the end of the day. Students can always use school phones to contact home. Parents can contact students via the school office.

House points awarded for tutor groups with excellent uniform, behaviour logs and detentions will be given to individuals for persistent poor uniform.

On PE and Dance Days only...	
School PE Kit to be worn to school. GAbbot hoodie or plain navy jumper/hoodie for warmth.	PE department will issue logs/detentions for incorrect kit.

⇒ A message from WisePay

We would like to offer our most sincere apologies for any inconvenience and temporary lack of service caused as a direct result of the recent cyberattack on WisePay. Thank you very much for your patience and understanding. We know how important our service is for you and please be assured we are working hard to ensure it's always there for you.

As you are aware, criminal hackers conducted a cyberattack on your school's WisePay platform starting late on 2 October 2020. We identified it on Monday 5 October 2020, and the WisePay security team promptly found and resolved the root cause within hours. We immediately took remedial measures to protect you and then also implemented additional checks and procedures common to the affected areas to ensure platform security. These resolutions have been validated and approved by a third-party, CREST-approved penetration testing company. This vulnerability was unforeseen by us and exploited by these criminal hackers.

We deeply regret the inconvenience caused to those affected by this incident. We reported the matter to the UK supervisory authority, as well as to law enforcement. We have provided your school with more details about the incident and our technical processes, in confidence and pursuant to our commercial agreements with them. For your convenience and in order to better support your needs, we have enhanced the parent support area on our website specifically regarding this incident. ⇒ REMINDER: Picking up children, dropping off items, visitors

A reminder, if your child has an appointment within school hours we will not be able to collect them from class. They must make their own way to reception to sign out. Please buzz at the gate and we will send them out to you.

We are still restricting the number of visitors to the site and there will be limited access via our pedestrian and vehicle gates. **Consequently, we will NOT be accepting any forgotten items at reception**, including Food and Nutrition ingredients. All visitors to the school MUST have an appointment.

All visitors to the site will be asked to wear a mask. We will be supplying Track & Trace forms at reception.

Please ensure you continue to send your child to school with a face mask. A lot of students continue to come into school without one. It is compulsory to wear one in corridors at all times.

Focus on—Pupil Safety and Dark Nights

On Saturday evening, we will be setting the clocks back an hour and summer time ends. Unfortunately, in the fortnight after this time change, we see a significant increase in road traffic collisions. Sadly, some of those collisions will involve child pedestrians and cyclists. Children under-16 are one of the most vulnerable groups of road users.

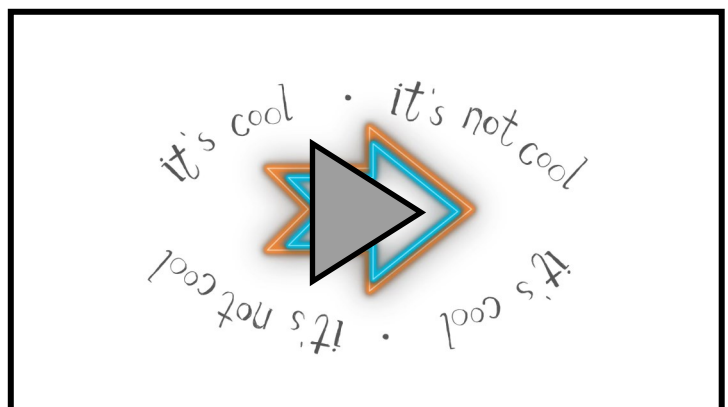
Please see the resources below to help remind your child, about road safety and safe cycling:

Cycling at night:

- When cycling at night, you need to make sure your bike has a set of good lights. By having white front lights and red backlights, other drivers are reminded that you are traffic too.
- It's also a good idea to have reflective items to highlight your presence too. Most bikes already come equipped with pedal reflectors and reflectors on the frame and wheels. You can also use ankle reflectors that help drivers recognise you as a cyclist due to your up and down movements.
- It is critical to be seen and to be visible when you commute by bike in the dark. Not only that, but cycling in the dark might also require you to make adjustments to your route or to your speed.
- Always have your lights with you, keep them on your bike or in your school bag.

5 top tips on how to BE BRIGHT & BE SEEN

- 1** Brightly coloured or fluorescent clothing shows up well in daylight and at dusk when you're heading to and from school.
- 2** If you're out and about when it's dark, wear reflective gear to make sure you can be seen in car headlights. Reflective vests, sashes or wristbands work well. Remember, fluorescent clothing doesn't work after dark!
- 3** Don't forget to accessorise! Even small items such as clip-on reflectors, armbands and stickers on your outfit or school bag are a great way to improve your visibility.
- 4** If you like to cycle, remember that it's the law to have clean and working lights at night (white at the front, red at the back), as well as a rear reflector. It's good to fit spoke reflectors too.
- 5** Of course, 'Being Bright' isn't the only way to stay safer. If you're out at night, choose routes and crossing places that are well lit and remember to always use the Green Cross Code.
