Headteacher's Message

As I write, it is Thursday evening and we have spent the week wrestling with exam board data entry systems which are being accessed by schools the length and breadth of the country, all trying to enter and authorise their Teacher Assessed Grades. I do want to particularly thank the data and exams team who have worked so hard to meet deadlines and ensure that our quality assurance systems have been thorough and robust. To mention them by name is, on this occasion, very important. Thank you to: Mr O'Sullivan, Mr Robinson, Mr Sugden – our Data Manager, Mrs Collett – our Assessment Manager, Mrs Gibbons – our Exams Manager. Our Heads of Department have been particularly busy standardising, moderating, collating, challenging and making sure that our students receive just and fair outcomes. Thank you to ALL of them. Next, we begin the two weeks of exams for both Year 10 and Year 12. We wish them good luck and remind them that hard work is necessary.

Thursday saw the visit of our Year 11s for their Sixth Form Induction Day. As anticipated, we had very strong numbers in attendance and much enjoyment of the Sixth Form Common Room, getting to know Maurizio (ic Sixth Form Café) and a free lesson. We really urged them to pay attention to the detail as they begin their Sixth Form journey – an apt quote was shared from Gareth Southgate on this very theme. A little luxuriant lazing this summer needs to be followed by focus, precision and a real determination to immerse themselves in the most fruitful years of their seven year journey. It is in the Sixth Form that we often see a finding of feet, a real and humble confidence in self and a delight in doing only the subjects that they have chosen. Definitely golden years in life's journey.

Sports Clubs and fixtures are continuing to take place with some big news of the week being the success of our Year 10 Cricket team, who won the Quarter Final of the County Cup and are progressing to the Semi-Final stage. Mr Rodgers was absolutely delighted with the strength of the team performance which ensured they won by 7 wickets. Our Year 12s have organised a hotly contested football tournament over recent weeks – the Euros have thus far been much less entertaining! The final match is scheduled to take place as part of Gabbot Fest. The current top two teams are: Pique Blinders and J5 FC! A fine example of community action was much enjoyed by all.

On that same theme of community action, I am so grateful to all of the students who have been involved in the Focus Groups we have run with every year group on the theme of sexual harassment. Their feedback has really helped us to be proactive on this issue. Our student voice has told us that they would like us to find different ways for our young people to easily report their concerns and that they would like us to ensure that no excuses are made for sexualised language and that it is never ignored. Just as racism is not tolerated in our school, sexual harassment is not either. They would like to learn more about how to keep themselves really safe online as soon as they start secondary school. They all reflected that lockdown has meant that they have spent more time at home with their devices. The Internet Watch Foundation's annual report for 2020 noted a 77% increase in cases of self-generated sexual imagery compared to the previous year. That statistic is deeply alarming. Our PSE curriculum has now been adapted accordingly. We will continue to ensure we actively shape our school culture so that this is a space of equality and safety for every George Abbot student.

Boris' announcement of 14 June will have an impact on some of our hoped for end of term activities. These are some of the key details:

- Sports Day will go ahead—students will need to sit in year groups on the field rather than their House groups so that bubbles are maintained.
- There will be no end of year House assembly—instead, we will announce the House competition results at the end of Sports Day.
- GabbotFest cannot happen in its usual format, with the whole school attending simultaneously—instead, year groups will attend in different lessons across the day.
- Year 11 and Year 13 Proms will not be able to take place. We will be in touch regarding any necessary refunds.
- Year 6 Induction Days will take place across 4 days with children attending in smaller primary school based groups and located in a separate area of the school.
- House Music—this will now need to revert to a virtual event.

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Lastly, I attach a letter which we have been asked to circulate to all parents/carers by Surrey County Council. Coronavirus infection rates in Surrey have risen significantly in recent weeks. They particularly urge parents/carers to make sure that your children stay safe outside of school. Here follows an extract from the letter attached:

Staying Safe Outside Class

Your child must follow the government guidance in force when outside of school or college. The changes around the gradual easing of lockdown apply equally to young people, so please encourage your children to follow the guidelines: Hands – Face – Space – Fresh Air.

Coronavirus restrictions remain in place across the country, including for people who have been vaccinated:

- You can meet indoors in a group of up to 6 people or a group of any size from 2 households.
- You can meet outside in a group of up to 30 people.
- Work from home if you can and travel safely.
- If you have symptoms get a test and stay at home.

There are three things that we can all do, to keep COVID at bay and see the ending of all restrictions safely:

1. Test regularly.
2. If you are an adult, take the Vaccine.
3. Hands – Face – Space – Fresh Air.



- To confirm your positive lateral flow test results


HOW LONG IT TAKES

- If you do not have symptoms of Covid-19
- As part of routine testing twice a week

HOW LONG IT TAKES

- Result processed by test device
- Around 30 minutes

- At home • At a test site • At work
- At your nursery • At your secondary school
- At your university • Order on line
- Collect from a pharmacy

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<p>Year 12</p>	<p>⇒ Work Experience A few students have requested information on Work Experience, especially as their placement week in May never went ahead.</p> <p>If a Work Experience placement is sourced during term time your child must see Mrs Nash or Mrs Rose, in USIC to collect the George Abbot Work Experience paperwork. This then needs to be completed and returned prior to the start of the placement.</p> <p>However, if your child undertakes a Work Experience placement during a school holiday, George Abbot School does not require any paperwork to be completed, nor will any checks be undertaken by us and there will not be a member of staff on-call. Work Experience during a school holiday is a relationship between parents/carers and your child and the employer, with parents/carers taking the responsibility for their child while on the placement.</p> <p>⇒ Year 12 Exams: Friday 18 June to Friday 2 July Year 12 students are now on study leave. Where there are Creative and BTEC subjects that are not scheduled to have exams, staff will inform students they are still expected to attend their lessons.</p> <p>⇒ Year 12 Next Steps Week: Monday 5 July to Friday 9 July Students will be off timetable for the week to receive informative talks from universities, apprenticeships, and employers. They will also begin their UCAS application, receive guidance from George Abbot Alumni on their experiences, learn interview skills and have the opportunity to receive 1:1 guidance on their post 18 options.</p>
