One of the best things about working and learning in a big school is the daily buzz and numerous interesting conversations we have within our community; whether they be with students, staff, governors or parents and carers. This week, we have been concluding our 1:1 meetings with every Year 11 student. These meetings are focussed on their next steps—the run up to GCSEs, their plans for post-16 study and their hopes for their futures. It has been an absolute privilege to talk to our Year 11 students; they have been thoughtful, reflective, ambitious and full of positivity for their futures. Hopefully, the conversations have also helped them to focus their efforts and feel secure in their aspirations.

This week has also concluded the process of UCAS applications for our Year 13 students. Mrs Rose, Mr Robinson and Mr Brinsden have been working with individual students to ensure sound advice and guidance, strong applications and ambitious but attainable applications have been submitted for University study. It is important that I give sincere thanks to the Sixth Form team for the superb work they do in supporting our Year 13s in this process. The team now moves on to supporting candidates who are applying for degree apprenticeships, apprenticeships, gap years or moving into employment.

Next week, our Year 9 students begin their 1:1 conversations with staff about their GCSE choices. We have listened to the consistent parent/carer and student voice that tells us that choice matters to our young people. Continuing to study 4 subjects in addition to Science, Maths, English, PE and PSE is really important to our George Abbot community. A significant body of research indicates that giving young people a sense of choice and ownership in their education is one of the most important things that schools can do to engage and motivate their students. I am certainly looking forward to meeting my Year 9 interviewees next week; annually this process reveals we have George Abbot students who do the most extraordinary things. We have pilots, authors, sportsmen representing their county and country and actors gracing local stages. We also have young people of immense personal integrity, kindness and ambition. These qualities are some of the most important to ensure future success for every George Abbot young person.


⇒ COVID-19 Pop up Vaccination Clinic at George Abbot

With the application date deadline in a few weeks, it is especially important that students due to sit BTECs this summer and need extra time, submit their evidence as soon as possible, but definitely before February half term. They need teacher comments and a piece of work clearly showing that they used 25% extra time in each subject. Year 11 Further Assessments and GCSE exams: w/c 28 February 2022 Year 11 The current guidance is that there will be a full examination series in May and June. The next significant milestone in this process will occur on 7 February, when there will be announcements regarding the content and mode of assessment for all subjects. Once this information is released we will share this with you. To support students with their preparation for the forthcoming examinations, there will be a Learning Conference focusing on developing the study skills and strategies for students to effectively prepare for their examinations. This will take place during the school day on Monday 21 February. There will also be a virtual session for parents/ carers on how best to support students at 6pm that evening. Mr Goulborn will contact you with further information about this event. During the week commencing 28 February, there will be a further set of formal assessments to ensure that students have experience of completing assessments under examination conditions. Students will receive individual timetables for these assessments prior to that week. Be safe, be seen: cycling and visibility

During the pandemic, we have been wearing masks to protect others. But when we're out on the roads, we need to think about how we can keep ourselves and others in our community safe. With the darker and gloomy days upon us, please encourage your child to be BE BRIGHT and BE SEEN when travelling to and from school.



The Highway Code states:

- Your child **MUST** wear or carry something **light-coloured**, **bright or fluorescent** in poor daylight conditions. When it is dark, use **reflective materials** (e.g. armbands, sashes, waistcoats, jackets, footwear), which can be seen by drivers using headlights up to three times as far away as non-reflective materials.
- At night your child's bicycle MUST have white front and red rear lights lit. It MUST also be fitted with a red
 rear reflector (and amber pedal reflectors). White front reflectors and spoke reflectors will also help you
 to be seen. Flashing lights are permitted but it is recommended that cyclists who are riding in areas without street lighting use a steady front lamp.

Please also INSIST your child wears a helmet when riding their bicycle.


