Headteacher's Message

This week's message aims to both celebrate our students and offer some support for parents and carers.

Firstly, to celebrate the achievements of over 100 George Abbot students who performed at the annual GLive concert organised by Rotary International. This year, four schools performed: Christ's College, Duke of Kent, Priorsfield and George Abbot. Though I appreciate my view is somewhat biased, it was the case that George Abbot's set of pieces was the most professional and consistently well performed of all of the schools present. Our Music Department have, yet again, supported our musicians in a performance of the highest quality. Thank you so much to all of the parents and carers who attended in support of our students and to all our students involved. They were tremendous and I am super proud of each of them.



Secondly, The British Psychological Society offers the following advice to parents and carers as we continue to hear daily updates regarding the plight of Ukraine. I hope it might be useful, particularly for those of you with younger children.

Talking to Children and Young People about War and Conflict - The British Psychological Society

Professor Hill advises:

1. **Give them the basics and don't avoid the conversation** – Listen to their worries and provide honest answers to their questions about what is going on, don't overcomplicate your responses and try to give details at an age-appropriate level. Don't avoid answering their questions about the situation as this could promote more anxiety, but keep to basic facts.
2. **Ensure they feel supported and safe** – It's important to help children understand the level of threat to them and their friends and family. Explain this is happening in Ukraine, a different country and show this if necessary using a globe or map.
3. **Manage your own feelings** - Try to deal with your own feelings of stress and distress in a way that it is managed as your children will be sensitive to your reactions.
4. **Explain to your children that bad things can happen in the world but there is always some way we can help** - Plan together how you might deal with this situation through fundraising or other actions to support the Ukrainian community.

5. **Avoid exposure to a constant stream of news** – Be mindful of whether you have the radio or TV on all day, as children will be absorbing news without us realising it. Try to build in 'breaks' from the news, for example, if you are picking up your children from school, turn off the radio or make sure it isn't on a news station to provide a break from the constant exposure to worrying rolling news cycles.
6. **Watch where they are getting their news** – We know that fake news is an issue, particularly on social media sites so be mindful of what your children are absorbing and where they are getting it. Ensure they understand that not everything they see on social media sites is true, and they know what reliable sources of news they can access.
7. **Seek advice and support if you are concerned about your child** – School staff can offer specific advice and support if you feel that your child is becoming overly anxious and distressed. Providing support and reassurance and diverting their thoughts through engagement in things they enjoy can help.

When thinking of some of the wider social media issues that our young people face in 2022, points 5 and 6 offer wise advice. Avoiding exposure to a constant stream of social media interactions and being really sure who is influencing our teenagers remain two key priorities for all of us trying to steer our young people through these treacherous waters.
