Headteacher's Message



I want to update all parents and carers on the new approach we are taking to mobile phones. We are phasing in the requirement for every new Year 7 cohort to put their phone into a signal blocking and locked phone pouch at the start of every school day. We are very concerned about the impact of social media and internet interactions on young people's concentration and mental wellbeing. We want to be leaders in a change of culture and support parents and carers with reducing dependency as your children become young adults. For our existing cohorts, phone pouches will now become a requirement as a sanction if phones are seen or heard in school. Persistent infringements of the policy will result in term-long periods of compulsory phone pouch use across the year groups. We hope that this shift will be one you support for the benefit of all our young people.

Our yearly school festival, where we come together to celebrate our community and raise money for local and national charities (UNICEF, Guildford Action, Helen Arkell Dyslexia Charity, Young Minds) and for school environment improvements is happening on Friday 12 July. \Rightarrow Free School Meals

We have been advised by Surrey County Council that we are able to issue a £90 voucher to students eligible for Free School Meals to cover the Summer Half Term. This voucher will be issued by email via Wonde. \Rightarrow Uniform top-ups for students in receipt of Pupil Premium

Parents/carers can order a uniform top-up from Valentino's, up to the value of £50, by ringing the shop and stating that their child is in receipt of Pupil Premium. If a more extensive uniform top-up is needed, parents/carers should contact their child's Head of Year.

\Rightarrow Safety on School Buses

Please ensure you remind your child that when travelling on school buses with seatbelts, the seatbelts must be worn. Additionally, students with bus passes must carry them to access a bus, and to avoid being refused entry.

If we have not received a response by 30 September 2024, we will donate any balances to the School Support Fund.
