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Education to Employment What's your next move?

All young people are expected by law to participate in education or training until they are 18, but this does not mean having to stay at school.

Post-16 options:

- Full-time study school / college
- Apprenticeship
- Part -time employment, or volunteering, combined with accredited part-time education or training

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What do these words mean....?

Vocational

Relating to, or directed to a job or business.

For example, training in care / media/hairdressing / carpentry/ construction.

Courses will have more practical elements and be more job specific.

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ACADEMIC

More traditional class-based learning with research. The qualifications are usually not directly related to an industry for example, A-Level History / Geography / English Language

There are different qualification levels that you can study towards and a number of qualifications you can achieve at each level.

Each level will open more OPPORTUNITIES to you, then you can make more choices in life

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QUALIFICATION LEVELS



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
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- There are 8 education levels
- ▶ Don't mix these up with GCSE grading scores
- You will leave George Abbot and start your journey either having achieved:
 - Level 1 (GCSEs grade1-3) or Level 2 (GCSEs grade 4-9)
- ► A-levels and equivalents are Level 3 qualifications







ACTIVATE LEARNING (taught at: Guildford College)

Level 3 (A-level equiv)

This qual will extend and develop your IT skills and prepare you for employment or study at university level. Topics includecomputer systems, software design, website production, computer games development and digital graphics. All 16-19 year olds on full-time programmes will be required to retake GCSE English and Maths or to undertake Functional Skills, if they have not already attained the equivalent of a GCSE grade C in these subjects, every year of their course, until they complete their studies. Those wishing to pursue a career in the IT industry, either in a business, technical support or networking capacity. Access to a range of software on networked PCS, all with internet access. Learn about the major topics of hardware, software, systems analysis and design, networking and database development.

- You need the full picture make sure you have all the information before you decide!

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- As soon as you have decided on your route APPLY to the school / college. If you need additional help with your choices please see the careers team.
- You can apply to as many schools / colleges as you wish to.
- If you are new to the UK, most colleges have ESOL courses, whereby you can spend a
 year improving written and spoken English and then apply for specific courses the
 following year.
- At the moment further education is free until you are 19 years old.
- You can also apply to other colleges; for example the ACM (Academy of Contemporary Music). However, this is a private college and fees will apply.
