Headteacher's Message

All

We are heading towards Christmas with alacrity. Our fantastic PTA organised a super successful Christmas Fair last Sunday. The hall was a-buzz with students, parents, friends and relatives with an enormous queue for the tombola resulting in hauls of sweet treats. Thank you to everybody who supported in any way. We raised just over £6000, a really welcome sum.

06 December 2024

Amidst the academic learning, enrichment opportunities, creative exploration, problem solving and social development that goes on in school, every day, we work hard to ensure we keep improving for your children, every day. This year, we are doing some work on Cognitive Executive Function. Executive functions are brain processes found in the prefrontal cortex of the brain. They are called executive functions because they help us to execute tasks and regulate our emotions. There are 11 executive function skills and they are:

- Response inhibition thinking before we act
- Working memory holding information while performing complex tasks
- Emotional regulation managing emotions to control behaviour
- Sustained attention
- Task initiation starting a task efficiently
- Planning/prioritising creating roadmaps to goals
- Organisation
- Time management
- Goal directed persistence reaching a goal despite competing distractions
- Flexibility adaptability to changing conditions
- Metacognition the ability to observe ourselves, self evaluating and adjusting

This list is a vital one for success as adults; skilling ourselves up to support the development of each of these areas in our young people is an important objective for us as educators. All of our children, including those who are neuro-diverse will significantly benefit from learning strategies to support their performance in these areas. Task initiation is one that challenges us all sometimes and is especially pertinent to homework. Here are 4 tips for working with your teenagers in this area:

- 1. Try behaviour contracting if/then: either a written or verbal agreement, with steps to success, a timeline and an agreed outcome.
- 2. Warm up routine: a simple and consistently implemented routine perhaps listening to a song, reading a motivational quote that you find together, two minutes of physical activity that act as a cue to get started.
- 3. Countdowns and timers.
- 4. Make it visual: a to-do list, a photo of a finished example, a daily schedule with visual symbols representing parts of an activity, a graph showing the minutes it takes to get started every day.

Maybe one of those ideas might assist with home learning in your family.

Thank you to all of our parents who completed the feedback snapshot for this term. Here is a summary of your response:

- 88% feel that their child is happy at GA
- 98% feel that their child feels safe at GA
- 83% feel that bullying is tackled proactively at GA
- 90% feel that their child can take part in clubs
- 88% feel that their child does well at GA
