Message from Mrs Carriett: On balance, I am always pleased when January ends; the mornings offer a little more light, snowdrops emerge, spirits lift.

Thank you to all of our Year 11 parents and carers for engaging with the Parents' Consultation Evening yesterday. Mission critical weeks ahead for our exam cohorts. Year 13 have their Parents' Consultation evening on Thursday 6 February from 3.45pm - 7pm - booking opened yesterday for appointments. Our Year 9 assessments take place next week -

an important set of exams carried out in our halls to set the tone for the GCSE years ahead.

This week has seen 'the big reveal' for our musical production this summer. We like to offer contrast, year on year, and so for this July, our performing arts team have selected Charlie and the Chocolate Factory. The musical was first performed in July 2013, though the Roald Dahl book dates from 1964. It offers great characters, a lively score and much visual appeal. Do keep the dates in your diary; 1-4 July, 2025. More imminently, tickets are now on sale for our Cabaret to be performed on 13 February, 2025. Next week sees Children's Mental Health Week; in preparation for this, students have all received assemblies around this year's theme Know Yourself, Grow Yourself. This theme encourages students to become more self-aware and to better understand ways that they might build healthy habits to support their wellbeing. 
⇒ Feature Assembly—Sexting/Sending Nudes and the consequences


Focus on
